Recent studies have shown that deficits in working memory can affect an individual's ability to focus attention, control impulses and solve problems, symptoms often associated with ADHD. New home-based computer techniques have been developed to help improve the function of working memory and control symptoms of ADHD in children, adolescents, and adults. Updated information on ADHD will also be shared.

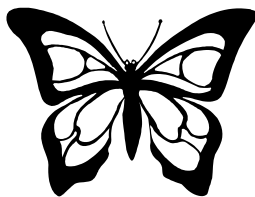
